Now is the Time! CCJRC is encouraging our members and the broader community to ‘Know Your District Attorney’ – THEY ARE ELECTED OFFICIALS!

The District Attorney (DA) is one of the most powerful players in the criminal justice system and very politically influential! In Colorado, the district attorney represents the people of the state and is responsible for prosecuting violations of the criminal laws that occur in their districts.

DID YOU KNOW?

DA’s have decision- making power to determine:

- Whether or not to file criminal charges
- Plea-bargaining
- Whether or not a diversion program is implemented
- Whether or not the death penalty is sought
- Services, compensation and funding for victims of crime

DA’s have power and influence beyond the courtroom!

- Public policy
- State and local budgets
- Public opinion on public safety issues
- Other government and elected officials

The power of the state to punish for crimes is profound, and the prosecutor directs this awesome power. How might ‘We the People’ control the choices of such a pivotal public servant?

WHAT IS THE IMPACT?

Community	A “tough on crime” view of DAs may not align with community values and can lead to mistrust and over-criminalization, particularly in communities of color.
Individuals & Families	Plea bargain decisions by DAs can significantly affect a person’s freedom, family stability and long-term opportunities to get employment, housing, or financial assistance for college.
Local & State Budgets	The DA’s decision-making drives prison and jail cost. As taxpayers, we foot the bill!
